In January 2021, the company entered into a Deferred Prosecution Agreement with the United States Department of Justice, Antitrust Division resolving the charge against the company, under which the company agreed to pay a \$20 million criminal penalty, admitted to participating in the charged conspiracy and agreed to fully cooperate with the Antitrust Division's ongoing criminal investigation and prosecution of others involved in the Savannah, Georgia ready mix concrete market. The Deferred Prosecution Agreement contains certain compliance obligations for a period of three years and, if the company complies with those obligations, the charges against the company will be dismissed at the end of the three-year period. The company fully intends to comply with all of its compliance obligations.
